Chiefdom. The world football governing body (FIFA) is funding the project whilst the chiefdom has allocated the land for the implementation of this vital football development project.

In order for football development to be effective, the availability of resources is very essential. It is for this matter that FIFA is funding such projects to member associations around the globe as an enrichment exercise for the growth of the beautiful game. Through FIFA funding, the

NFAS is in possession of some assets which includes the Sigwaca House (Head Offices of the NFAS); which has been recently extended with a commercial wing for revenue generation purposes, Technical Centre in Lobamba and the King Sobhuza II Stadium.

Now the focus is on the construction of the technical centre at KaLanga in Siteki. This infrastructure development project is scheduled to be completed in seven (7) months' time. This is already evidenced by the extended wing of the Sigwaca House, which is termed an income generation wing, with the capacity to generate revenues for the organization and its activities. The same will be applicable for the regional infrastructure where possibilities of income generation for their maintenance and daily football exertions will be harnessed.

Infrastructure will therefore play a key strategy in the development, competitions and governance of the game of football.
