He further highlighted that this was the second opposition as they as they last played against Botswana and seemingly the players are improving their football skills. Eswatini lost the first match against Mozambique by 2-1 and won the second one by 2-1. The national team is scheduled to leave for Malawi on the 9th of October 2019 and their opening match of the COSAFA Championship is on the 12th October 2019 against Zambia.

This event was for the U13 boys and U15 girls. Eight (8) Primary Schools were competing on the day. The schools were Elangeni, Lobamba National, John Wesley, Sydney Williams, Entuthukweni, Ezulwini Catholic, Montessori Life and Enjabulweni Primary School. They were categorised into two groups which competed in a round-robin format with the top two teams advancing to the knock-out phase.

Lobamba National was crowned the champions of the Futsal U15 girls after defeating Montessori by 5-2. To reach the finals, Lobamba defeated Entuthukweni by 3-0 whilst Montessori was the finalist after winning against John Wesley by 3-1. The Primary Schools Futsal U13 boys were Sydney Williams who defeated St Mary's by 9-0. To reach the finals Sydney Williams defeated Montessori by 6-0 whilst St Mary's were the finalists after winning against EzulwiniCatholic by 2-1.
