participated with a sum of twenty-four (24) schools. This reflected a total of three hundred and eight- four (384) girls compared to six hundred and eight (608) in 2017 were able to showcase their talent in as far as the beautiful game is concerned.

This Schools' Women Development Programme commences at the zonal phase, then the regional phase and finally the national phase. The zonal and regional phases are played in a round robin format with the top two (2) schools on the log qualifying for the regional championships. The same format applies to the regional championship acts as the climax of this Women's football development programme which is a one (1) day event.

The round robin format is also used at this level with the top two (2) team in each of the 2 groups qualifying for the knockout stage that will finally produce the national champions. In this

year's edition, a total of ten (10) schools participated in the national championships, with each region represented by 2 schools.

In this year's edition, the NFAS partnered with Ocean Basket and Mandla Mahewu with the former sponsoring the champions with a soccer kit and the latter sponsored the event with 250 units of Mandla Mahewu.

The other 2 schools were filled by 2 private schools as National Football Association of Swaziland (NFAS) introduces Women's in private schools as well. This year's participation schools in the national championships were, Njabulweni, Elangeni, Phonjwane, Moyeni, Hluthi Central, Hillside, Koberamokgadi, Makhosini, Ntfonjeni and Nkalashane High Schools. The best player was Nonkululeko Sibandze from hillside High School, the best goalkeeper was Nokulunga Lukhele from Elangeni High School and the top goal scorer was Siboniso Dlamini from Elangeni High School.

As from the 2017/2018 football season, the will be a change in as far as the registration of players is concerned, for the Premier League; National First Division and Super Leagues football clubs. Previously, the registration of players was done manually which involved a lot of paper work. This modernized platform has come with some benefits which includes more efficiency and information about players just to mention a few. Players can be registered anywhere, anytime as long as there is a laptop /desktop that is connected to the internet. Less paperwork will also be used as the data will be filled in soft copies.

"As a way of facilitating this exercise, the National Football Association of Swaziland (NFAS) has workshopped the affected affiliates' members", said the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the NFAS. The CEO also stressed that, this was a vital exercise as the FIFA Connect Registration Platform is the only registration

process applicable to Premier League; National First Division and Super League football clubs.

"The workshops were very important as the FIFA Connect Registration Platform will be the only registration platform that will be applicable to the Premier League; National First Division and Super Leagues football clubs, however; the registration office will be available for assistance whenever football clubs encounter some challenges", said the CEO of the NFAS. This workshops were facilitated by the NFAS Information Technology Specialist, Mr Vusi Khoza and the International Affairs Manager; Miss Ntombifuthi Dlamini The first window registration period for the 2017/2018 football season commenced on Monday, 10th July and will close on Friday, 22nd September 2017. Football clubs are urged to register their players.

SNAP SHOT OF FIFA CONNECT

FIFA connect is a registration platform that is introduced by FIFA to her member associations to adopt and implement in registering their stakeholders. This registration programme will enhance the gathering of data from every corner of the football world. The goals of this registration programme include the systematic registration of players and other stakeholders, the establishment of information systems standards for the exchange of data between member associations, and the promotion of a more fact- based management of football development activities following a global standard.

The FIFA Connect platform will help in keeping track of the stakeholders like players, coaches, referees and administrators wherever they are

in the world. It provides a unique ID code to everyone who has a role in the football association and this code acts like a digital football passport. It has information on the history of each stakeholder on his/her role in football over his/her life.

The information is very important to help on issues like receiving compensation for international transfer, controlling players' ages, enhancing football governance, and protection of minors among others. This platform will further enhance the National Football Association of Swaziland (NFAS) in the organization of competitions.

The local side won the first match by 2-1 and lost the second match by the same score line. According to the head coach; Mduduzi Nxumalo, the national team is improving fitness wise as the competition draws nearer. "Ever since we started our full time camp, there is progress in terms of the fitness level in as far as the players are concerned", said the head coach. He also

highlighted that the national team is also improving defensively as the major focus will be on transition play.

COSAFA WOMAN'S CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 2016 COSAFA Women's Championships will be the 5th since the initial competition in 2002. Other COSAFA Women's Championships were in 2002, 2006, 2008 and 2011. The first tournament was held in Zimbabwe and the champions were South Africa after they won against Zimbabwe by 3-1.

South Africa retained their title in 2006 in the some competition that was played in Zambia. In 2008, the COSAFA Women's Championships was played in Angola. Again South Africa defended the title and were crowned Champions for the 3rd time in a row. Zimbabwe became the 2nd nation to win the COSAFA Women's Championships after defeating South Africa by 4-2 after penalty shoot-outs. This was in 2011 where they were also hosting the competition.
