

FIFA MA ELITE REFEREES COURSE

The FIFA MA Elite Referees Course, which commenced on Monday, 4 August 2025, concluded on Friday, 8 August 2025 at the EFA Technical Centre in Lobamba. The five-day programme had 34 elite male and female referees as participants, was facilitated by FIFA Referee Experts Paulo Marques and Mark Mzengo, in collaboration with local referee instructors. The main objective of this course was to



equip Eswatini's referees, with the new refereeing rules and technology.

Speaking on behalf of the participants, was Sanele Ntimane who expressed gratitude to FIFA and the EFA for their unwavering support. He noted that the course had introduced them to new concepts of the game and emphasized the importance of continuous practice and self-investment in their officiating careers. He highlighted that both the theory and practical sessions of the course, enhanced their knowledge about modern refereeing.

Addressing the referees, he acknowledged the significant task ahead of applying the recently amended Laws of the Game in the new season. He urged them to remain composed under pressure and reaffirmed the EFA's commitment to supporting refereeing development, including the introduction of new refereeing technologies in the future.

REFEREES IN FOCUS WITH MR. ZONDO



Ahead of the new season, we caught up with Sifiso Zondo to discuss referees development and the lessons from the two recent FIFA MA Referees Courses

Question 1 (Q.1.): As we begin the 2025/26 football season, how are the referees preparing for the upcoming competitions?

Sfiso Zondo (S.Z.): The referees are prepared theoretical and physically. EFA has organized some courses, workshops to equip the local referee from various level of refereeing. They

also undergo fitness training which helps keep them in good physical conditions.

Q.2.: Can you briefly reflect on the previous 2024/25 season? What were some of the highlights, challenges, or lessons learned from a refereeing perspective?

S.Z.: It was a successful season; However, there were some challenges. Sometimes referees are vulnerable to security issues like, being threatened by team officials and fans. The most common challenge is the misinterpretation of the Laws of The Game (LOTG). I think the gap of interpretation and understanding of the Laws of The Games may be narrowed by educating the teams (Coaches, Players, etc) at the beginning of each season.



Q.3.: Earlier this month, the EFA hosted the FIFA MA Elite Referees Course, and last month the FIFA MA Youth Referees Course. What impact do you expect these programs to have going forward?

S.Z.: These Courses enhanced the referee's interpretation and application of the LOTG. They also capacipated the participants in as far as refereeing is concerned

Q.4.: What steps are being taken to ensure that referees are physically and psychologically prepared for the new season?



S.Z.: The EFA has organized numerous courses, workshops and Fitness trainings; which align with the preparation of the match officials ahead of the new season 2025/26. The preparations covered all aspects of refereeing

Q.5. : Lastly, what message would you like to share with football stakeholders regarding the role and importance of referees in the game?



S.Z.: I would like to highlight that the referees are among the priority athletes football. Therefore, referees the law are enforcers in the game of football, So thev must protected and respected all at times. All football stakeholders have a responsibility respect the referees and their decisionsts.



EFA SHOWCASES FOOTBALL CAREERS AT WATERFORD KAMHLABA CAREER EXPO



PIGGS PEAK BUILD IT

The Build It Piggs Peak Under-13 Tournament, was held on Saturday, 9 August 2025, at the Killarney Sports Ground in Piggs Peak, proudly hosted by Build It Piggs Peak. The day was filled with passion, skill, and promising young talent, but it was Mshinande Arsenal F.C. who stole the show, lifting the trophy after a dominant run.

From the opening group stage match, Mshinande Arsenal F.C. established themselves clear favorites. Their teamwork and passing were far beyond their age group, making them a joy to watch. They conceded only two goals throughout the tournament, one in the group stages and another in the semi-finals, while scoring freely and with style. Their second group match showcased their attacking firepower, thrashing Tinyosi F.C.11-0 in one of the most lopsided victories of the day.





In the semi-finals, Mshinande F.C. defeated Arsenal Zibonele F.C. by 4-1, sealing their place in the final against Maguga FC. The championship match was effectively decided in the first half, with Arsenal surging to a 3-0 lead. NHLANGANO BUILD IT

The King Sobhuza II Memorial Stadium was buzzing with excitement on Saturday, 23 August 2025, as the Build It Nhlangano Store proudly hosted the seventh edition of the Build It Under-13 Football Tournament. Despite the windy and chilly weather, the young players showcased remarkable determination, skill, and passion for football, while parents and supporters filled the stands, cheering enthusiastically throughout the day.

Hosted by the Build It Mbabane store, this marked the 8th and final leg of the 2025 countrywide Build It U13 series, which successfully reached communities in Siteki, Manzini, Siphofaneni, Matsapha, Buhleni, Piggs Peak, and Nhlangano.



The Mbabane edition did not disappoint, delivering football excitement, passionate support, and a showcase of young talent. In the end. Lobamba **Dynamos** were crowned champions after edging out Dark City 5 - 4 on penalties, following a nail-biting goalless draw in the final.

SUMMARY OF IMPLEMENTED PROGRAMMES

Significant progress has been made in football development. Grassroots football has been rolled out in the Shiselweni and Lubombo regions. The U-20 Girls' Football for Schools programme is operational, alongside ongoing U-15 Boys' and Girls' leagues under the Football for Schools initiative. Furthermore, three Basic Coaching Courses have been conducted, contributing to the expansion of our coaching base

ADVICE TO COACHES AHEAD OF THE NEW SEASON

As the season begins, I would encourage coaches to prioritize proper planning and preparation, both technically and physically. Focus on building strong team cohesion, instilling discipline, and ensuring players understand their tactical responsibilities. It is also important to manage player workloads carefully to avoid early-season injuries. Above all, coaches should emphasize consistency, patience, and continuous learning, as the foundation laid in the early stages often determines the success of the entire season
