SIHLANGU SEMNIKATI WRAPS UP WORLD CUP QUALIFIERS

The nation witnessed a heartfelt homecoming on 8 October as Sihlangu SeMnikati returned to hosting at Somhlolo National Stadium after 7 years away, facing Angola in their penultimate FIFA World Cup Qualifier. The chilly weather did the little to cool the excitement, as passionate fans filled the stands to cheer on the national team.



Sihlangu showed impressive determination in the first half pressing high, defending tightly, and matching Angola's intensity. The teams went into the break level at 0-0, with the SeMnikati looking sharp and composed.

The second half brought fireworks as interim coach Sfiso Ntibane's Tactical changes paid off immediately. Justice Figareido struck twice in quick succession, putting Eswatini ahead 2-0 and sending Somhlolo into celebration.



Angola however mounted comeback, scoring in the 69th minute and equalizing at the 80th. **Despite** conceding late, Sihlangu maintained their fighting spirit and nearly sealed a victory deep in time, stoppage narrowly missing a well-crafted chance.

Just days later, on 13 October, Sihlangu travelled to face Cape Verde for their



final qualifier. The hosts, eager to secure qualification, faced a determined Eswatini side that held them to a goalless draw first half. Though Cape Verde ultimately won 3-0 Sihlangu SeMnikati fought valiantly until the final whistle, earning respect for their resilience and teamwork. With that, Eswatini concluded their World Cup Qualifiers campaign with three points in Group D, leaving behind performances that showed growth, grit and the promise of a bright future for our national team.

The event held alongside the EFA/CAF African Schools Programme under 15 activities, brought together learners, teachers, and coaches from schools across the country to raise awareness about the Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccination.



The Initiative highlighted the importance of early vaccination in preventing cervical cancer one of the leading health challenges affecting women globally. Health officials conducted interactive sessions to educate the young participants about HPV and healty living

On Saturday the 4th of October, The Eswatini Football Association (EFA) successfully hosted the EFA/CAF African Schools Grassroots Festival at Somhlolo National Stadium. This vibrant event brought together 400 Under-15 boys and girls from 20 different primary and high schools, all participating in the FIFA Football for Schools Development Programme.



Despite the cool weather, the atmosphere in stadium the was warm and energetic, the young players showcased their passion, teamwork, and enthusiasm throughout the day.

The festival aimed to equip learners with fundamental football techniques while enhancing their understanding of the game. Teachers who

are also youth coaches gained valuable technical knowledge on how to effectively train and guide young players.

The playing pitch was transformed into a series of training stations, each focusing specific football skills, including ball control, crossing, dribbling, passing, marking, penalty shooting, throw-ins, kicks, and warm-up corner routines. By the end of the noticeable festival, improvements were observed among the participants, many of whom demonstrated



newfound confidence and ability on the field.



MULASPORT NATIONAL FIRST DIVISION USHERS IN A NEW ERA





The country's second tier league has officially kicked off under a brand new identity. The Mulasport **National** Division. This First follows the exciting sponsorship shift from MTN to Mulasport. A proudly Swati betting company that has invested E4.5 Million into the league in a partnership set to run for three years.

The new deal marks a major milestone for Eswatini Football, signaling growth and confidence in the local game. Already, the league has delivered entertaining fixtures and fierce competition, as

It is worth noting that this season has ushered in a historic sponsorship milestone for Eswatini football. The Premier League signed a three-year E22.5 million partnership with MTN Eswatini.



while the National First Division secured its own E4.5 million deal with MulaSport, also running for three years. This marks the first time in nearly 24 years that the two leagues have

attracted separate sponsors, signaling the sport's growth and widening corporate appeal. These partnerships are expected to bring



significant benefits to both players and clubs, including incentive programme designed to reward performance and commitment throughout the season. The PLE views this diversification of sponsorship as a major step forward in strengthening the financial base and overall competitiveness of the local game.

In line with efforts to modernize football operations, the PLE has also embarked on digital transformation initiatives. One of the key innovations for this season is the PLE Smart Card, a first of its kind in Eswatini football,



which is an NFC-enabled physical and digital membership card for fans of the Premier League of Eswatini, costing E150 annually and linking to a unique fan profile with loyalty points. It is Powered by SkyFly and MTN MoMo, it enables fans to tap for cashless payments at stadiums and partner outlets, secure digital access to events and promotions, discounts on merchandise and partners, and exclusive content such as league updates. The card will also boost teams financially as the ratios of sharing revenue of the smart card will be 80 % to teams and PLE, and the remaining 20% will be for SkyFly.



Additionally, all match day tickets are now exclusively available through Moja Tickets, a nationwide platform with multiple outlets that enable fans to purchase their

tickets conveniently before match day. On arrival at stadiums, fans simply scan their tickets for entry, a move aimed at improving efficiency, reducing congestion, and enhancing the overall match day experience.

Despite these positive developments, infrastructure remains a challenge for clubs, many of which continue to rely on privately owned or rented facilities.



Several key venues, including the Prince of Wales Ground, Killarney Sports Ground, and Somhlolo National Stadium, are still undergoing renovation. The PLE, however, continues to receive invaluable

support from Mavuso Sports Centre and Manzini Club, which have provided reliable venues for league fixtures and other Premier League Tournaments like the recently hosted 8bet Cup.

In an effort to address the matchday venue shortage, the League has also acquired Bhunya Stadium, currently being tested with National First Division fixtures to determine its suitability for Premier League matches. While this is a step forward, the League recognizes that



hosting games far from urban centres such as Mbabane and Manzini presents logistical and financial challenges for supporters.But I personally send out deepest appreciation to fans who continue to travel long distances to support their clubs, often at personal expense. Their loyalty and passion is commendable, as such dedication forms the foundation upon which Eswatini football continues to build.




