The Eswatini Football Association (EFA), alongside the entire national football fraternity, extends its warmest congratulations to EFA President Mr. Peter 'Samora' Simelane following his successful election to the Council of Southern African Football Associations (COSAFA) Executive Committee.



The landmark election took place on Sunday, May 17, 2026, during the COSAFA Elective Annual General Meeting (AGM) held in Harare, Zimbabwe. The prestigious regional event was notably graced by the President of the Confederation of African Football (CAF), Dr. Patrice Motsepe.



Mr. Simelane's ascension to the regional executive arm highlights his growing influence and the rising profile of football governance in Eswatini. This milestone follows a rigorous process overseen by the COSAFA Electoral Committee, which confirmed the new leadership structure in accordance with international sporting statutes.

During the same elective congress, Oabile Thona Tariq Babitseng of Botswana was officially confirmed as the new COSAFA President, stepping into office alongside Madagascar's Alfred Randriamanampisoa, who was elected Vice-President.



Mr. Simelane joins a distinguished group of ordinary Executive Committee members entrusted with steering the trajectory of Southern African football for the 2026–2029 term, including:

- Lijane Nthunya (Lesotho)
- Nqobile Magwizi (Zimbabwe)
- Robert Shimooshili (Namibia)
- Brenda Kunda (Zambia – Reserved Women’s Seat)

The EFA notes that this regional appointment beautifully complements Mr. Simelane’s existing international responsibilities, including his current seat on the FIFA Member Associations Committee. The executive board, technical staff, and sports stakeholders across Eswatini express supreme confidence that his leadership will significantly advance the beautiful game both at home and across the broader COSAFA zone.



CAF EFA U15 AFRICAN SCHOOLS NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The future of Eswatini football continues to shine brightly as the ongoing CAF EFA Under-15 African Schools Championships provide a powerful platform for young football talent to showcase their abilities and compete for national recognition.

The exciting youth tournament, which features both boys' and girls' competitions, has brought together some of the country's most promising young footballers from various schools, all competing with the dream of representing Eswatini on the

continental stage. A total of 10 schools are participating in the boys' category, while 8 schools are battling for glory in the girls' division, creating a vibrant and highly competitive football environment for the nation's emerging stars.



Hosted every Wednesday and Friday, the championships continue to attract attention as young players display impressive skill, determination,

and passion for the game. Beyond the competition itself, the tournament serves a much greater purpose in Eswatini football

development, as it forms part of the selection process for the national Under-15 squads that will represent the country at the upcoming CAF African Schools Football Championship scheduled to take place in December. As the tournament progresses, competition is expected to intensify with players eager to impress selectors and secure places in the national squads ahead of the continental championships later this year.

FIFA EFA GIRLS FOOTBALL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME CONTINUES TO EMPOWER THE GIRL CHILD

The FIFA EFA Schools Girls Development Programme continues to play a vital role in the growth of women's football in Eswatini by creating competitive platforms for young female players to develop, showcase their talent, and progress into higher levels of the game.

The Under 19 programme in good collaboration between FIFA, EFA and PC Systems currently features 12 high schools, with matches taking place every Wednesday and Friday. This development programme serves as an important feeder platform for the national Under-20 women's team, helping identify and nurture some of the country's brightest young girl's football talents. Beyond national team development, the programme has also become a key scouting ground for clubs competing in the Eswatini Women Football League. Since its launch, a growing number of talented girl players have been identified and recruited by women's league teams, highlighting the programme's increasing impact in opening doors and creating opportunities for young girls in football.

At grassroots level, the initiative also includes 10 primary schools competing in the Under-15 division, providing younger players with early exposure to organized football competition while helping prepare future generations for junior national team structures. Through consistent competition, talent identification, and player development opportunities, the FIFA EFA Schools Girls Development Programme continues to strengthen the foundation of women's football in Eswatini while inspiring more young girls to pursue their passion for the sport.

EFA INTERMEDIATE COACHING COURSE

The Eswatini Football Association's commitment to developing football from the ground up continues to gather momentum, following the successful conclusion of the EFA Intermediate Coaching Course, a key initiative aimed at strengthening the quality of coaching within the country. The course officially came to an end on the 10th of May, with participants sitting for their final examinations after undergoing an intensive two-month learning programme designed to sharpen both their technical understanding and practical coaching abilities.



Led by EFA Technical Director Boy Mkhonta alongside EFA Instructor Vusisizwe Mahlalela, the programme brought together aspiring and developing coaches from different football backgrounds, all united by one goal, improving their knowledge of the modern game and preparing themselves for higher levels of football coaching. Over the course of two months, participants took part in a balanced structure of weekday online learning sessions and practical weekend engagements, creating an environment that tested both discipline and commitment. According to the instructors, the journey was made easier by the outstanding attitude and cooperation shown by the coaches throughout the programme.





Speaking on the overall experience of the course, the instructors highlighted the dedication displayed by the coaches, noting that attendance and participation levels remained impressive from start to finish. Whether during online theory classes or on-field practical sessions, participants consistently showed eagerness to learn, arriving in full numbers and actively engaging with every aspect of the programme. EFA Technical Director Boy Mkhonta described the course as productive and encouraging, emphasizing that the true reflection of the programme's success will now be seen through the examination results and, more importantly, through how the coaches apply their knowledge within their respective football environments. While the instructors are confident that valuable lessons were shared throughout the programme, the final assessment scripts will ultimately reveal how much information was absorbed and understood by the coaches.



Meanwhile, anticipation continues to build around the long-awaited return of the prestigious CAF Licence Coaching Courses, which the EFA has revealed are gradually being prepared for a comeback after a lengthy absence. The return of CAF-accredited coaching programmes is expected to mark another major milestone for football development in Eswatini, opening doors for local coaches to obtain internationally recognized qualifications and further strengthen the country's football landscape.

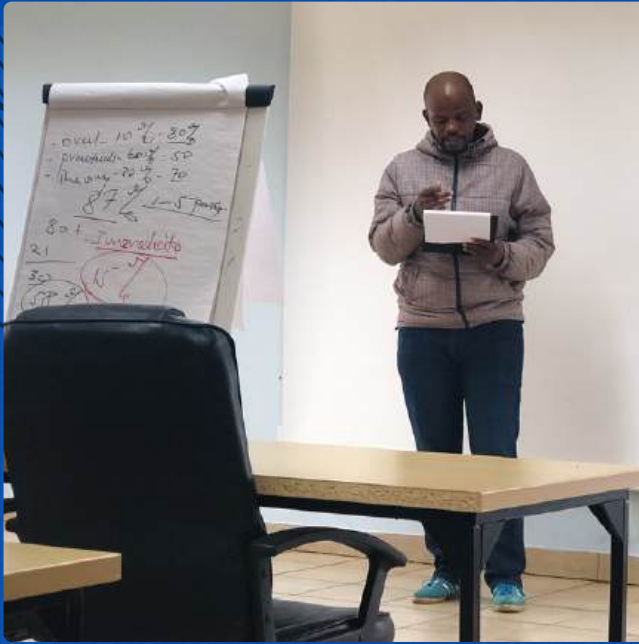
EFA BASIC COACHING COURSE

The Eswatini Football Association's mission to develop football, through education and technical empowerment, in as far as coaching is concerned, gained momentum following the successful conclusion of the EFA Basic Coaching Course, which officially came to an end on Sunday, 24 May 2026.



The course, which commenced on the 1st of March 2026, was designed to equip aspiring coaches with foundational football coaching knowledge and practical skills, while also creating opportunities for more emaSwati to become actively involved in football development. Over a demanding two-month period, participants underwent structured learning sessions that combined weekday online theory classes with practicals training sessions and classes on weekends, which ensured a balanced and comprehensive coaching education experience. Much like the recently concluded Intermediate Coaching Course, the Basic Coaching programme focused on both theoretical understanding and practical application, helping participants develop confidence in handling players, planning training sessions, and understanding the modern demands of football coaching.





The final stages of the course tested the coaches across different areas of learning. The examination process began on the 16th of May with oral assessments involving all 48 participating coaches, allowing instructors to evaluate their communication, football understanding, and coaching awareness. This was followed by practical examinations on the 23rd of May, where participants were assessed on their ability to conduct and manage training sessions on the field. The programme officially concluded on the 24th of May with the final theory examination, marking the end of an intensive but

rewarding journey for the aspiring coaches. Throughout the duration of the course, the programme was led by EFA Instructors Musa Mamba and James Kunene, who guided participants through every stage of the learning process. Speaking at the conclusion of the course, many of the coaches expressed gratitude to the instructors for their patience, professionalism, and dedication, highlighting that they made learning easier and more enjoyable despite the demanding nature of the programme. The participants confidently expressed optimism about their performances in the examinations, stating that the quality of instruction had prepared them well for success.



Instructor Musa Mamba also commended the aspiring coaches for their discipline, commitment, and cooperation throughout the entire programme. He praised the participants for maintaining strong attendance and positive attitudes from the very first day until the final examination, emphasizing that such dedication is essential for the continued growth of football coaching in Eswatini.



Football enthusiasts and aspiring coaches are encouraged to stay informed through official EFA communication platforms, as announcements regarding the next intake for both the EFA Basic and Intermediate Coaching Courses will be made soon. The programmes remain open to all individuals passionate and interested in football coaching.

SLIM CHANCES FOR ESWATINI'S MAIDEN APPEARANCE IN THE FIFAe CONTINENTAL CHAMPIONSHIP

The ongoing FIFAe Nations League is gaining momentum following the conclusion of Week 1 matches. "Consistency points" are currently the focus, as they are vital for securing automatic qualification to the Continental Championship. The top five national teams based on aggregate consistency rankings, along with the top three performers from Week 1 to Week 3, will qualify for the championship.

WEEK 1 REVIEW

After successfully advancing from Group D in the African Zone on May 5, 2026, the Eswatini national team faced Morocco the following day. During the group stages, Eswatini recorded one win, two draws, and one loss, finishing fourth in their group with 5 points. Their results included:

- Draws: 1-1 against Zimbabwe and 0-0 against Ghana.
- Win: 2-1 against Madagascar.
- Loss: A heavy 7-1 defeat to Tunisia.

In the subsequent knockout round, Eswatini fell to Morocco with a 5-0 aggregate score, losing 2-0 in the "home" leg and 3-0 "away." These results left Eswatini with a total of 110 consistency points, placing them 13th in the continental rankings.

WEEK 2:

Eswatini must significantly improve their performance in the second week of competition (scheduled for 8 June 2026) to climb the rankings. The format will remain the same as Week 1, with more consistency points at stake.

WEEK 3:

This will be the final week of qualifiers. The group stage format will return, with the top two nations from each group advancing to the quarterfinals. The three best-performing teams from this week will join the five already qualified via the Consistency Ranking to complete the field for the Continental Championship.

THE INSPIRING JOURNEY OF NJABULO SIPHEPHO

“ My rise in refereeing is a story built on nothing but discipline, sacrifice, passion and an unwavering love for the beautiful game.

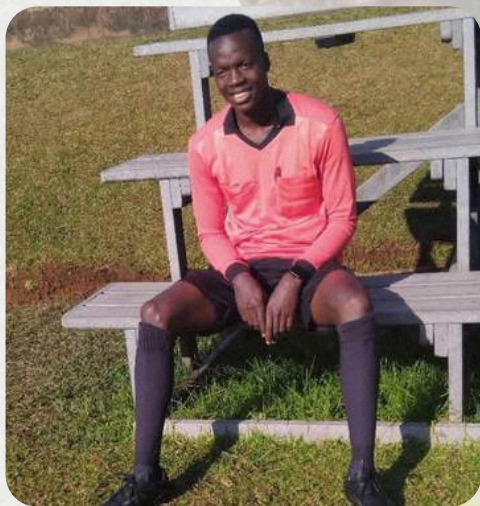
Being appointed to officiate the prestigious SMVAF Ingwenyama Cup Final 2026 was not only one of the proudest moments of my career, but also a defining milestone in my journey as a referee. Officiating in the middle of such a high-profile encounter, in front of Their Majesties and thousands of passionate supporters, was both humbling and inspiring. It was a moment that reminded me that hard work, consistency, and dedication never go unnoticed.





With such a big occasion came immense pressure. The SMVAF Ingwenyama Cup Final is one of the biggest football spectacles in Eswatini, a stage where emotions run high and every decision matters. But as I stepped onto the field, I reminded myself to remain calm, focused, and trust the

experience that I had gained over the years. Officiating a match of that magnitude gave me confidence and strengthened my belief that I am capable of competing at even higher levels in football officiating. It was more than just another assignment, it was confirmation that indeed only the sky is the limit.



My love for refereeing began at a very young age while I was still a football player. Growing up in the game, I was inspired by senior referees who carried themselves with professionalism, confidence, and authority. Watching how they controlled matches and earned respect from players and supporters made me realize that

refereeing was not simply about blowing a whistle, but about protecting the integrity of the game itself. I understood that even if I was not on the pitch as a player, I could still contribute to football in a very important and meaningful way.

As time went on, I developed a deep passion for understanding the Laws of the Game, match management, and the responsibility that comes with making crucial decisions under pressure. Locally, I have always admired experienced referees such as **Letticia Vianna**, who have represented Eswatini with pride and professionalism on bigger stages. Internationally, one of the referees I look up to is **Omar Abdulkadir Artan** from Somalia, whose authority, confidence, and consistency continue to inspire me every time I watch him officiate.



Like every referee, the journey has not always been easy. One of the hardest parts of officiating is dealing with criticism after difficult decisions, especially because many people do not fully understand the pressure referees face during a match. Football moves quickly, and referees are expected to make major decisions within seconds, often under intense scrutiny from players, coaches, fans, and the media. What many people forget is that referees are human beings too. Mistakes can happen, just as they do with players and coaches. However, I have learned that pressure and criticism are part of football, and instead of allowing negativity to discourage me, I choose to learn from every match and continue improving myself.





Refereeing also comes with many sacrifices. It demands discipline, physical fitness, constant training, and continuous study of the Laws of the Game. There are times when I have to spend long hours away from family and loved ones in order to

prepare for matches or attend training sessions. But despite the sacrifices, my passion for football keeps me motivated every single day. What drives me the most is the dream of representing Eswatini at the highest level possible and proving that referees from our country can officiate on the international stage.



Beyond football, I see myself as a humble, disciplined and hardworking individual who values family, respect, and personal growth. Those values have shaped the person I am today and continue to guide me both on and off the field. I believe that success is not only about talent, but also about character, consistency, and the willingness to keep learning.





My biggest dream is to officiate at major international tournaments such as the Africa Cup of Nations and ultimately the FIFA World Cup; To one day stand on those stages would mean everything to me. It would be proof that dedication, sacrifice, patience, and perseverance truly pay off.

However, I know there is still room for growth. I will continue working on improving areas such as communication, match management, and maintaining consistency in high-pressure situations because excellence in refereeing is a continuous process.



Looking ahead, I see myself officiating regularly at international level within the next five years, while also helping mentor and inspire

young referees who want to grow in the profession. I want to contribute not only to my own development, but also to the growth of refereeing in Eswatini. Our country has talented officials with great potential, and I believe the future of refereeing in Eswatini is very bright.

To every young person dreaming of becoming a referee, my message is simple: believe in yourself, stay disciplined, work hard, and never give up. Success does not come overnight. It comes through patience, sacrifice, commitment, and the courage to keep pushing forward even during difficult moments. Refereeing is not an easy

journey, but for those who truly love football, it is one of the most rewarding paths you can take. ”
